Current Situation:

- PPE continues to be an issue however as it arrives it is pushed out by SEOC.
- **FIRE DEPARTMENTS NEED TO COORDINATE WITH THEIR COUNTY EM TO ENSURE THEIR PPE NEEDS ARE CLEARLY UNDERSTOOD**
- State IMT's deploying today to support field hospitals, ACHA to add a 1-member team for regulatory guidance.
- Positive cases and the need for ICU/Ventilators remain stable.
- Messaging for continued social distancing
- Continued focus on long term care facilities with REST and IMT teams.
- Enhanced focus on the homeless population and shelters and preventative measures.
- *On-going:* Working to determine effect of COVID-19 on the Fire Service personnel and departments.
- *On-going:* Florida's 5 STEPS to combating COVID-19
- *On-going:* USCG continues to monitor cruise ships off Florida's coasts.
- *On-going:* Continued evaluation of the need for additional field hospitals for surge capacities.
- *On-going:* Draft Wildfire Contingency Plan developed and is under review by FFS. Currently 44 active wildfires
- Monitoring weather moving in from the south that will bring breezy and rain conditions midday and early afternoon to NE FL and Panhandle.
- 21,019 COVID-19 cases; 513 deaths; 201,005 people tested seconded only to NY.
- Total SEOC Missions: 14,108
- **FL Professional Firefighter COVID-19 cases*:**
 - **68 Cases**
 - **753 Out of Service****


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Social distancing measures are taken to restrict when and where people can gather to stop or slow the spread of infectious diseases. Social distancing measures include limiting large groups of people coming together, closing buildings and canceling events.

Protect yourself and your community. Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after going to the bathroom, before eating, and after blowing your nose, coughing or sneezing. If you don't have soap and water, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol. Avoid close contact with people who are sick, and stay home when you're sick.	Change your daily habits. Avoid shopping at peak hours and take advantage of delivery or pick-up services with retailers.
Look for communications from universities and colleges. Regarding suspending classes, going to web-based learning and canceling all large campus meetings and gatherings.	Work with your employer. Cooperate with leadership to change company practices, set up flexible shift plans, have employees telecommute, and cancel any large meetings or conferences.
Don't travel to areas with active outbreaks.	Keep at least six feet between you and other people. Avoid shaking hands as a social greeting.
Don't travel to areas with active outbreaks.	Avoid crowded places. Sporting events, community festivals, and concerts.
