## FFCA Fire Service Liaison Officer's Information Dissemination for April 6, 2020

#### **Current Situation:**

- Current modeling indicates peak on or about April 21st. This is two weeks earlier than previous model.
- Continue to work and plan with a sense of urgency
- New Public Health Advisory being prepared and could be out as soon as today.
- The three Community-Based Testing Sites (Duval, Orange and Miami) will transition from Federal to State operations on April 10th.
- Sarasota and Lee Counties potentially have a bed shortage.
- Rapid Tests: The State is only considering the Abbott Laboratory test for possible use.
- On-going: Working to determine effect of COVID-19 on the Fire Service personnel and departments.
- On-going: Very limited PPE available.
- On-going: Continued monitoring of cruise ships off Florida's coasts.
- On-going: Continued deployment of two field hospitals and evaluation of deployment of third, which all will be hospital (non-ICU) level.
- On-going: Waiting on guidance from Surgeon General on first responder passive exposure
- On-going: Wildfire contingency plan still being developed
- Currently 48 active wildfires
- 13,324 COVID-19 cases; 236 deaths; 116,898 tested
- Total SEOC Missions: 11,627
- FL Professional Firefighter COVID-19 cases: 44\* as of 4/6/20
