### EO 20-91:

**Effective Today until April 30th**







## Cumulative Resident Cases

1. Enhance data tracking in counties with over 100 cases. Create GIS layers by zip code to show cases, testing sites, and hospital surge information.
2. Continue to evaluate social distancing compliance in population centers over 100,000.
3. Ensure that communities over 100,000 have medical surge plans in place and are prepared to implement them.
4. ESFs distribute guidance for their specific industries.
5. Implement further social distancing initiatives within the SEOC.
