





Cumulative Resident Cases




Community Lifeline Status


Ongoing medical supply limitations have the potential for leading to a destabilization of the health and medical lifeline.

Emergency Services	
ESF 4/9	Coordinating Fire-Rescue specific guidance for COVID-19.
ESF 8	Coordinating epidemiological investigations and contact tracing. April 4, 2020 10am DOH Coronavirus: summary of persons being monitored, persons under investigation, and cases. Developing and distributing guidance for healthcare facilities, vulnerable populations and the general public. Supporting the 24/7 COVID-19 Hotline: 1(866) 779-6121
ESF 13	Supporting operations throughout the state including medical, security and logistical needs.
ESF 16	Coordinating with FLNG and other partners in support of EO 20-80, 20-82, and 20-86. Providing awareness on continuity procedures to partners.

Human Services	
ESF 6	Working with partners to address anticipated needs and challenges including: Mental Health, Emotional and Spiritual Care, Feeding, and Vulnerable Populations. Coordinating with Fiscally Restrained Counties to identify anticipated State support. Messaging to houses of worship to distribute guidance on how to remain Spiritually United, Social Distanced. Working with partners to coordinate noncongregate sheltering needs. Supporting Feeding Florida's Operations.
ESF 11	Supporting ESF-6 with food, water, and ice distribution in the state of Florida. TEFAP (Providing nutritious, high-quality foods to low-income households). Summer Break Spot or call 211 (Feeding children while schools are closed). The Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants and Children provides nutritious, high-quality foods and formula to pregnant women and/or young children in low-income households/those who lose their jobs or are laid off due to COVID-19.
ESF 15	Asking organizations to use Volunteer Connect as a virtual board to advertise opportunities: https://volunteer.volunteerflorida.org/ Surveying county capabilities and needs.
ESF 17	Coordinating with State Animal Response Coalition (SARC) to facilitate messaging for remaining pet food donation to county municipal animal shelters in regions 4, 5, and 6. Projecting needs of pet food for food insecure households.
ESF 18	Assessing the economic impact of COVID-19 on Florida. Visit floridadisaster.biz to access the Business Damage Assessment Survey. Supporting assistance for businesses and workforce; including Reemployment Assistance and the SBA Economic Injury Disaster Loan program.
