





Cumulative Resident Cases




Community Lifeline Status


Ongoing medical supply limitations have the potential for leading to a destabilization of the health and medical lifeline.

ESF 4/9	Coordinating Fire-Rescue specific guidance for COVID-19.
ESF 8	Coordinating epidemiological investigations and contact tracing. April 11, 2020 10am DOH Coronavirus: summary of persons being monitored, persons under investigation, and cases. Developing and distributing guidance for healthcare facilities, vulnerable populations and the general public. Supporting the 24/7 COVID-19 Hotline: 1(866) 779-6121
ESF 13	Supporting operations throughout the state including medical, security and logistical needs.
ESF 16	Coordinating with FLNG and other partners in support of EO 20-80, 20-82, and 20-86. Providing awareness on continuity procedures to partners.
