




New Resident Cases per Day








Lab Test Results per Day

The Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants and Children provides nutritious, high-quality foods and formula to pregnant women and/or young children in low-income households/those who lose their jobs or are laid off due to COVID-19.

Governor's Plan for Reopening

Full Phase 1

- Schools continue distance learning
- Visits to senior living facilities are prohibited
- Elective surgeries can resume
- **Restaurants, retail, museums, and gyms may open Monday, May 18th at 50% capacity**
- **Professional sports may resume operations**
- **Amusement parks may submit a reopening plan**
- **Vacation rentals may seek approval to operate through their county**
- Hairdressers are now open
- Vulnerable individuals should avoid close contact with people outside the home.
- All individuals, when in public, should maximize physical distance from others.
- Avoid socializing in groups of more than 10 people in circumstances that do not readily allow for physical distancing
- Face masks are recommended for all those face-to-face interactions where you can't social distance
