Current Situation:

*On-going: PPE continues to be an issue; logistic requests for PPE should be **realistic** and not exceed a 10 day burn rate. Use the standard Requisition Request. **Fire Departments to coordinate with their County EM to ensure their PPE needs are clearly understood.**

*Related to the above: The Batelle PPE decon station for cleaning masks is in service at the Hardrock stadium in Miami currently. All health and fire systems who need masks are encouraged to gather their used masks for cleaning and bring or send them by Fed Ex to the site. The process takes 3 days

Continued need and focus for testing with a greater concentration on rural, underserved populations and ALF's.

Developing pre-hurricane season strategies for submission to FEMA. **We're one** month away from the start of the hurricane season.

- Launching mobile lab (vehicle based) with up to 500/day testing capability to go into communities. Developing a route plan for mobile lab, which is scheduled to begin this week Tuesday with emphasis on ALF's.
- On-going: Request for ESFs to evaluate what possible actions/changes would be in line with potential opening of businesses and activities.
- *On-going:* Surgeon General and staff preparation and strategy development for antibody testing, possibly by next week.
- Weather Forecast: An extended dry period started on Saturday and is ongoing. High pressure will remain through Tuesday. Minimum relative humidity could drop to near critical levels, especially in the peninsula. Models show extremely low relative humidity on Wednesday and Thursday this week, which could elevate fire danger.
- On-going: Active Wildfire Report. Currently 49 active wildfires, 2707 acres
- COVID-19 cases; 1399 deaths; 445,995 people tested, 36,897 positive, over 50% of those are in SE FL. 431 occurring in long term care facilities
- Current positive testing rate remains stable at 8.3% Total SEOC Missions: 17,813

COVID-19 impact to Florida Firefighter Cases, reporting on 33,104 FF's from 262 departments. Positive cases:150. Out of Service: 353. Fire Service Liaison Officer Requests Submitted: 22


