Current Situation:

On-going:* PPE continues to be an issue; logistic requests for PPE should be **realistic and not exceed a 10 day burn rate. Use the standard Requisition Request.

***Related to the above:** The Batelle PPE decon station for cleaning masks is in service at the Hardrock stadium in Miami currently. **All health and fire systems who need masks are encouraged to gather their used masks for cleaning and bring or send them by Fed Ex to the site.** The process takes 3 days

- PPE requests within WEBEOC have significantly declined in the past few days.
- **Antibody testing and mobile lab testing kickoff today in Miami-Dade at Hardrock to coincide with the Governor's visit**
- Continued effort and focus on expanding community-based testing sites
- DOH developing long range care model and sustainability plan
- Continued need and focus for testing with a greater concentration on rural, underserved populations and ALF's.
- Developing pre-hurricane season strategies for submission to FEMA. **We're one month away from the start of the hurricane season.**
- Reminder that the Stafford Act incident period will close at some point and reimbursements will modify or cease. Begin considerations and preparations now. Consideration in development of a **Train-the-Trainer type course** for long term care facilities with mandatory training implementation surrounding infectious disease.
- Planning for two new community-based **testing sites; Brevard and Volusia Counties**-open next week
- *On-going:* Surgeon General and staff preparation and strategy development for antibody testing, possibly by next week.
- **Weather Forecast:** Minimum relative humidity could drop to near critical levels, especially in the peninsula. Models show extremely low relative humidity on Wednesday and Thursday this week, which could elevate fire danger.
- COVID-19 cases; **1539** deaths; **482,005** people tested, **38,002** positive, over 50% of those are in SE FL. **529** occurring in long term care facilities. **Current positive testing rate 7.9%**
- **Florida continues to see a reduced positivity rate**
- Total SEOC Missions: **18,266**
- **COVID-19 impact to Florida Firefighter Cases, reporting on 33,118 FF's from 266 departments. Positive cases: 152. Out of Service: 325. Fire Service Liaison Officer Requests Submitted: 22**
- *On-going:* Active Wildfire Report. Currently **57** active wildfires, **4647** acres

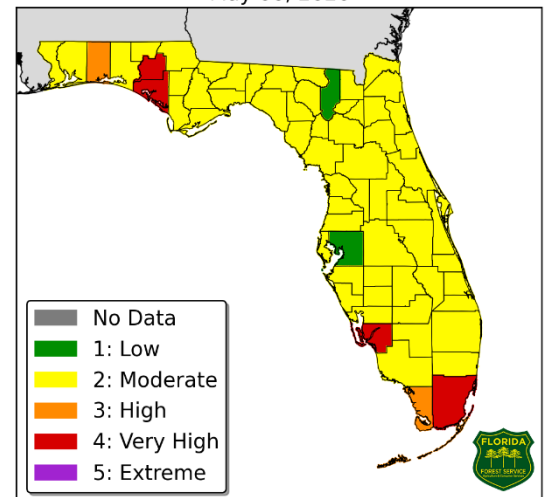
Social Distancing for Infectious Disease

Social distancing measures are taken to restrict when and where people can gather to stop or slow the spread of infectious diseases. Social distancing measures include limiting large groups of people coming together, closing buildings and canceling events.

Protect yourself and your community. Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after going to the bathroom, before eating, and after blowing your nose, coughing or sneezing. If you don't have soap and water, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol. Avoid close contact with people who are sick, and stay home when you're sick.	Change your daily habits. Avoid shopping at peak hours and take advantage of delivery or pick-up services with retailers.
Look for communications from universities and colleges: Regarding suspending classes, going to web-based learning and canceling all large campus meetings and gatherings.	Work with your employer. Cooperate with leadership to change company practices, set up flexible shift plans, have employees telecommute, and cancel any large meetings or conferences.
Keep at least six feet between you and other people. Avoid shaking hands as a social greeting.	Avoid crowded places. Sporting events, community festivals, and concerts.
