- Florida's 5 STEPS to combating COVID 19
 - **S**top the introduction of COVID 19
 - **T**est, test, test
 - **E**lderly and vulnerable protection
 - **P**repare the hospitals
 - **S**ocial Distancing
- COVID-19 Activation day 76
- Currently 47,400 positive cases of COVID-19 in Florida with 2,143 deaths reported.
- Shifting major new outbreaks worldwide in countries previously unimpacted, 800K persons from Brazil traveled through Miami International Airport last year
- Intense tracing of COVID-19 patients to begin in southeast counties by the State.
- 5M doses of Remdesivir anti-viral vaccine being ordered, developing plan and needed supplies to administer
- FEMA issuing guidance on dual response to COVID-19 and Hurricanes simultaneously
- Retesting at sites from damaged tests today, 1,700 damaged in transit to labs
- \$681M in purchase orders, continue to right size and reduce amounts as appropriate.
- CDC to disseminate guidance on reopening of Universities, focus on distancing.
- DEM is offering use of state term vendors current contract for masks to state agencies, agencies to purchase on their own. DEM only purchasing to support COVID-19 operations.
- Agency IT should be monitoring for data breeches which have increased. Report incident to FDLE Cyber crimes unit.
- Continue testing in the foreseeable future.
- Will take SEOC to Level 2 once key points are hit, TBD
- When moving to Level 2 will consist of full staffing M-F 8am-5pm
- NOAA and the Universities are increasing the hurricane season predictions to above average season. New information will be released later today.
- It is predicted that the State will be experiencing thunderstorms across the state today with average of 1" or less rainfall in most locations.
- Weekend staffing will be 9-5, Memorial Day Monday support ESFs on call.
- Active fires (statewide): 68 for 14,168 acres
- Florida Fire Service Impact – out of 35,048 employees reported, 339 out of work, 168 employees testing positive
